Read the two versions of the story of Little Red Riding Hood and answer the questions.

Did you know that the story of Little Red Riding Hood has various versions in different parts of the world.

One of the most common versions is: Little Red Riding Hood was a sweet little girl, loved by all. She loved her grandma the most. One day, her mother told her that her grandma was ill. So she decided to visit her and give her cookies. Her mother advised her not to talk to any strangers and to go straight to her grandma's house without stopping anywhere. She went through the woods, where she found a wolf. At first, he wanted to eat her. But after talking to her, he found out that she was going to visit her grandma. The wolf thought it would be a much better lunch if he could eat both of them. He distracted Little Red with flowers and reached her grandma's house before her.
