Birds

Birds are feathered animals that can fly in the sky. They come in many shapes, sizes, and colors. Some birds, like eagles and hawks, have sharp claws called talons. Birds build nests to lay their eggs and raise their babies. They eat different foods depending on their beak shape—some eat seeds, others eat insects or fish. Birds use their wings to fly and their beaks to pick up food. They are important for spreading seeds and pollinating flowers. However, some birds are losing their homes because of changes in the environment.

Butterflies

Butterflies are colorful insects that can be found in gardens and fields. They have delicate wings covered in tiny scales. Butterflies come in various sizes, from small to large. One interesting thing about butterflies is their life cycle—they start as tiny eggs, then turn into caterpillars, form a chrysalis, and finally emerge as butterflies. Butterflies use their long tube-like mouthparts, called proboscis, to sip nectar from flowers. They help pollinate flowers and plants while they feed. However, butterflies face threats from habitat loss and pollution, which are causing their numbers to decline in some places.
