

RULES OF COMMAS

Read the rules of commas below and write two sentences of your own.

Rule 1

Use a comma to separate an introductory clause or phrase from the rest of the sentence.
Example: Actually, all of us are going on a picnic.

Rule 2

Question tags are added at the end of sentences to ask for confirmation or agreement when we are unsure.
Example: Your brother is in the army, isn't he?

Rule 3

Use a comma to set off the words "yes" and "no."
Example: Yes, I'd like to drink orange juice.

Rule 4

When addressing a person or thing directly, the name used must be separated with a comma.
Example: Are you tired, Carl?
