

Winter Addition and Subtraction

Solve the following word problems.

- John bought 4.25 pounds of salt to melt the ice on his driveway. He used 2.15 pounds in the morning and 1.35 pounds in the afternoon. How much salt does he have left?
- 2 Sarah made 6.50 gallons of hot chocolate for a winter party. She used 2.75 gallons for the first batch and 1.50 gallons for the second batch. How many gallons of hot chocolate does she have left?
- Mike has 7.85 meters of Christmas lights. He used 3.45 meters on the tree and 2.10 meters on the window. How many meters does he have left?
- 4 Emma has 5.60 pounds of flour. She used 2.25 pounds to make cookies and 1.75 pounds to make a cake. How many pounds does she have left?
- David has 8.45 gallons of antifreeze. He used 3.35 gallons for his car and 2.15 gallons for his truck. How many gallons does he have left?
- Anna bought 9.75 pounds of sugar. She used 4.25 pounds for baking cookies and 3.50 pounds for making candies. How many pounds does she have left?
- Sam has 10.85 liters of paint. He used 4.35 liters for the living room and 3.25 liters for the kitchen. How many liters does he have left?
