

Travel Addition and Subtraction

Solve the following word problems.

1 John drove 345 miles on the first day and 256 miles on the second. If he can only drive the car for 1,000 miles, how many more miles can he go?

2 Mike has 800 dollars for his trip. He spends 350 dollars on the first day and 200 dollars on the second day. How much money does he have left?

3 Emma and her family went on a vacation. They traveled 450 miles on the first day and 300 miles on the second day. If they can only drive the car for 1,000 miles, how many more miles can they go?

4 Tom has 1,000 dollars for his vacation. He spends 300 dollars on the first day and 400 dollars on the second day. How much money does he have left?

5 Anna and her friends are on a 500 miles road trip. They traveled 250 miles on the first day and 30 miles on the second day. How many miles do they have left to travel?

6 A couple embarked on a cross-country journey, covering 400 miles on the first day and an additional 300 miles on the second day. To reach a total distance of 1,000 miles, how many more miles must they drive on the third day?

7 Lisa and her friends are on a road trip. They have driven 650 miles so far and have 200 miles left to their destination. How many miles is their total journey?
